Animation and sound required. iMovie presentation must be 3-5 minutes.	Must be 3-5 minutes. Script must be turned in 1st. May be live or recorded on flash drive. Must have props or costume. Up to 2 people. Both must have active role and their own book.
Storyboard	News Report	You Be the Person
Use 1 poster board. Must have setting, characters, conflict, rising action, and resolution. Should be neatly written or typed. Include pictures and color. iMovie presentation must be 3-5 minutes.	Must report who, what, when where, why, and how of topic. Must be 3-5 minutes. Script must be turned in 1st. May be live or recorded on flash drive.	Take on the roll of a character. Must have 5 important facts. Should be 3-5 minutes. Script must be turned in 1st. Must have props and/or costume.
