#### **Read Fit**

AMS supports the Read Fit initiative for the 2016-17 school year! RICA teachers are promoting and encouraging all students to increase their reading to include at least 15 minutes per day. This time will be provided at the beginning of each class. Teachers will assist students in choosing reading materials that will interest and engage students.

# Reading Response Journal

Response journals require the students to write and reflect about information gathered from the reading material (novels, informational text, etc). This strategy encourages students to think deeply about the materials they read and are valuable for prompting opinion making, value judgments, and critical thinking. The response journal is viewed as a piece of ongoing assessment. Students are required to bring a book (or other reading material) to every class.

#### **Vocabulary Workshop/Word-Busting**

Vocabulary activities (analogies, word origins, synonyms/antonyms, etc.) will be completed throughout the week. Please check my website for word lists and scheduled assessments.

# **ELA Writing Support**

RICA classes will provide support a for Language Arts teachers to increase learning opportunities in areas of need and enrichment. The focus areas will be determined by ELA teachers during the school year.

# Make-up Work
